Course title: Final Paper			
Professor/assistant: The professor that teaches the course (professional or professional-applicative) that the student has selected as his subject for the final paper			
Type of course: Compulsory			
ECTS credits: 8			
Prerequisites: All courses successfully finished/all exams passed			
Aims of the course: To independently solve real problems from the field for which the student was educated for.			
Learning outcomes: The student is able to use gained theoretical and practical knowledge and apply it in practical work.			
Syllabus: <p><i>The Rulebook on preparing the Final Paper</i> defines the procedure of selection, preparation, registration and defense of the Final Paper. <i>The Rulebook</i> stipulates that at the beginning of every school year a number of topics is defined for all courses, which is agreed on and accepted by the members of each Study Group and the list of topics is published on the notice board and the website of the College. When a candidate fulfills the necessary requirements (controlled by the Student Affairs Office), he chooses the topic and the mentor for the Final Paper.</p> <p>In co-operation with the mentor, the candidate starts working on the final paper that should contain the results of the candidate's work. The work must be written with respect to the scientific style of writing. The literature used must be accurately referenced.</p> <p>The mentor proposes a committee of at least 3 members to review and evaluate the Final Paper. The committee includes: the head of the study program (as a chairperson), a mentor and a professor from the study group who is expert in the field closely related to the Final Paper topic. The Final Paper cannot be defended until approved by the mentor and committee members.</p> <p>To defend the Final Paper the student makes a presentation in Power Point and presents the facts.</p> <p>The Defense is scheduled within 30 days after the submission of the Paper, and is announced on the College's notice board.</p>
